	ENGLISH LANGUAGE	
	READING	Daily story time will continue which will encourage the children to extend their vocabulary and learn new words. We will discuss the pictures and say what we think might happen next. This term we will look at stories that have rhyming in them and encourage the children to think of their own rhyming words.- The books will also have repetition and the children will be encouraged to predict and say the words that will come next. Some of us will be working on reading books either reading the stories for ourselves or making our own stories using the pictures. Some of us will be working on our sounds and learning to put these together to make words with more confidence.
	WRITING	Some of us will be working on pre-writing skills, following patterns and practising our pencil grip. Some of us will be working on correct letter formation. We will be using our pencil control skills for mark making and drawing pictures. Some of us will be using the laptops to re-tell our own stories and drawing a picture to match.
	LISTENING & TALKING	We will all be listening to stories and some of us will be re-telling stories in our own words. We will practice listening to and following instructions. Some of us will be using listening skills tasks to improve our listening.
How can parents help		Looking at the pictures of a book and asking questions about what they can see. Reading stories together regularly. Looking for words in the home/environment that they may recognise.

	MATHS	
		This term our topic maths will be time. Some of us will look at sequencing and placing events in the order they would happen. We will be looking closely at our visual timetables and the children will be encouraged to take more ownership of those and use them to navigate their day more independently. Some of us will look at the days of the week and their order. Some of us will be looking at clocks and learning o'clock and half past on both analogue and digital clocks. There will be lots of counting opportunities, investigating numbers, some of us within 10 and some of us working on numbers to 100.
How can parents help		At home you can encourage using the clock and asking them what the time is. Talk about day and night and the order we do things in, first we get up and get dressed, next we have breakfast ...etc Lots of counting and ordering numbers practice would be great too.
HEALTH AND WELLBEING / INTERDISCIPLINARY LEARNING		



Through our cooking club we will be learning where our food comes from. We will be looking at the healthy plate and discussing what categories the ingredients we are using fit in to.
