 Literacy	ENGLISH LANGUAGE	
	Reading	Class readers will continue to come home regularly and the children will begin to answer simple comprehension questions in class. We will be working on blending and fluency. Some children will have an Accelerated Reader book and others, a choice of book from the library.
	Writing	P1 will develop their knowledge of writing in sentences. We will be focusing on narrative writing and linking this to well-known fairy tales. Phonics will continue regularly, alongside tricky word practise and letter formation. We will also begin to look at dictation of simple sentences, to help improve the children's confidence to write independently.
	Listening & talking	We will be doing class talks this term. Pupils will be asked to create a short presentation on a subject of their choice, as a homework activity. We will continue to work on our listening skills across the curriculum.

 Numeracy	MATHS	
	Number and number processes	In fractions, we will be looking at splitting whole objects into smaller/equal parts. We will use visual, concrete and numbers to do this. The children will begin to use appropriate vocabulary to describe halves and quarters and gain an understanding of the written formation e.g $\frac{1}{2}$, $\frac{1}{4}$.

	Time	We will be exploring daily routines, linking them to times of the day, days of the week and month of the year. We will also be looking at reading the time on analogue clocks and measuring time using stop watches and timers.

	Data	We will be using graphs and charts around us, to interpret data and discuss the results. We will be collecting and organising simple data, often outside e.g car surveys, leaf collections and weather observations. We will be using tally marks and displaying the information gathered in pictograms and graphs.
How can parents help		❖ Encourage your child to: ❖ Look at the times routines are followed within day e.g tooth brushing, bedtime, clubs etc. Discuss morning, afternoon and evening activities. ❖ Look for fractions in shops, on food or clothes e.g – half price or sharing a chocolate bar. ❖ When driving, encourage your child to look for different coloured cars and ask them, which did you see most/least of? ❖ Practise LEARN ITS at home

	We will be learning through our IDL about how to keep safe and healthy. PE will be on a Tuesday with Mr Kearton - we will be working on how to throw underarm to a target and continue to focus on catching skills, cooperative games and activities. Later this term we will practise athletic skills and activities in readiness for Sports Day. On a Wednesday with Mrs Herschell, we will be working on circuits and learning how exercise affects the body. OSCARS will continue and will be presented at the weekly Assembly.
