	READING	We will learn and develop letter sounds following Jolly Phonics, fun actions and rhymes alongside other sound activities to build early reading skills. P2 will follow daily reading groups with supporting activities. Recapping and applying tricky words and phonic sounds.
	WRITING	We will develop our letter formation and fine motor skills (handwriting presentation scissors skills), thinking about the correct shape and where to start on a letter and of course froggy fingers! (tripod pencil grip.) We will develop our name writing considering capital letters and smaller, lower case letters. We will take part in emergent literacy games and activities to help our understanding of how language and writing works. P2 will work on news writing(recount) and writing for understanding. Considering spelling patterns, sentence structure and grammar points eg nouns
	LISTENING & TALKING	We will develop core listening skills through following instructions. We will practice social cues i.e. listening to others and sharing respectful opinions. We will work with P67 buddies and friendships.

	Number and number processes	Recognise and develop understanding of number values. Looking at numbers 0-10. Practical counting, recognition and writing of digits through games and songs. Counting forwards and backwards. Understanding order, more and less and number lines. Number facts/bonds. P2 addition and partitioning- place value. Use of > <
	Time	Understand and be aware of daily routines and time scales.. E.g days, months, seasons. Use of clocks (analogue and digital) to calculate time. Am and pm times P1- O'clock and half times P2 Quarter past and time facts Write and record timed events.
	Information Handling	Collect Data to make diagrams, tables and charts. Read and find record information with support from diagrams. Use and understand tally marks to count and record data.

How can parents help	Encourage your child to: ❖ Look for numbers around them – e.g. on houses, number plates ❖ Ask what comes next? more than ? less than? ❖ Find calendars clocks timers in everyday situations. ❖ Practise counting items. Sorting items by colour, shape or size. ❖ What can you do in 1 minute? ❖ P2 making tally and bar charts- asking questions for a survey. What's your favourite?
