READING		Reading assessments have been carried out at the beginning of term. Accelerated reader levels are based on these and children will be given books at the correct level. These will be read in class and be taken home – children should be bringing these in every day. Weekly comprehension tasks will be completed to develop reading skills and children will continue to read in groups to focus on oral fluency.			
WRITING		We will develop our letter formation and handwriting presentation, thinking about the correct shape and where to start on a letter. We will continue developing spelling using daily activities and grammar i.e. capitals, sentence structure and tricky words. This term recounts will be the writing focus.
